ABOUT DZHERELO

Dzherelo is a training and rehabilitation centre that provides quality family-centred services for a maximum number of children and young people with special needs and high-risk children in Ukraine.

Our service package includes:

- consultations;
- daytime rehab programs;
- early intervention;
- training programs,

all of which are provided by a highly skilled interdisciplinary team of professionals in collaboration with the parents.



The Dzherelo Centre is a charitable institution founded in 1993 by parents of children with special needs and volunteers from Canada.

The first six children with specificneeds started attending a regular kindergarten; subsequently, the first minibus was donated to the Centre for transportation purposes.

In 1994, municipal authorities presented the Centre with an abandoned building located in one of the suburbs of Lviv for the purpose of building a new rehabilitation centre.

Construction continued slowly as more and more charitable funds were raised, as the number of children registered in the programs increased, and as more and more children and young people began filling the Centre's new premises.

WE CREATE OPTIMUM RESULTS AND BRIGHT FUTURES FOR ALL CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS AND THEIR FAMILIES.



As of 2008, all services are provided in partnership with the city of Lviv. Asemi-public municipal rehabilitation facility was foundedon the basis of a charitable foundation. Working together with the Lviv Department of Humanitarian Policy, we have developed new opportunities for children and young people with special needs, thus marking the implementation of a service network in our city.

Today, more than 200 children and young people with different intellectual and physical developmental disorders attend the Centre where they take part in various activities. The 6,000 sq.m. of the building are fully accessible, equipped with elevators and ramps; 7 minibuses fitted with lifts deliver the children to the Centre and take them back home. With the support of the Renovabis Foundation (Germany), we launched a training centre for specialists and profile organizations from all over Ukraine, and organized twelve guest rooms to accommodate families with their children. The Centre team consists of more than 120 highly qualified professionals who continually expand their knowledge and instruct others, provide vital services and family support, and are highly motivated to work and serve on behalf of the children and their families.
